Texas Governor Calls for Special Session Attacking Teachers

AUSTIN, Texas — Rumors of a special session were put to rest today after Gov. Greg Abbott's announcement in his press conference. Abbott stated that anti-teacher payroll deduction legislation would be included in the special session call.
